4. Target from Left	The equine places both front feet on the mat target as the handler stands to their left.	10		
5. Target Back	The equine begins with their front feet in front of the mat and backs both front feet onto the mat.	10		
6. Back	The equine backs two steps away from the handler.	10


2. Target From Front - The equine places both front feet on the mat target as the handler stands directly in front of them.
